Professor **Alan Burrett** (Lighting Design Faculty) designed the lights for Puccini's <u>Madame Butterfly</u>, currently running at San Diego Opera. (Reviews <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>.) **James Tan**, Year II MFA Lighting Design student, is co-designing a dance performance with Alan at 10th Avenue Theatre - <u>Voices: Mapping the Hood</u>, presented by Eveoke Dance Theatre. This performance is one component of a two-part artistic rendering of stories titled *Art at the Core: Building Community*. The stories being told are about the people and the places that make up the sister communities of North Park and City Heights. Using art as the catalyst, Eveoke Dance Theatre hopes that their multimedia dance theatre production and visual art Installations will reflect lived experiences, collective concerns, and community celebrations.



On Tuesday, March 10th, the Romanian Association of Theatre (UNITER) published the list of nominees for the 2008 Annual Theatre Awards. The Hungarian Theatre of Cluj received 7 nominations out of 9 possible categories for *Three Sisters*, which opened in September, directed by **Gábor Tompa**, Head of MFA Directing at UCSD. Gábor was nominated for "Best Director" and **Andrei Both**, Head of Design at UCSD, was nominated for "Best Stage-designer." The awards were made on April 27<sup>th</sup> – Gábor won for

"Best Director" and the company won for "Best Performance of 2008."


