


FACULTY AND STAFF NEWS

MFA 3 Directing student Adam Arian writes from New York: "I am directing a show for the New York Musical Theater Festival, called... ahem ahem... "<u>Fantasy Football, The Musical</u>?" And it is a big honking, pedal-to-the-metal joyride. Totally self-aware, more than a little touching, funny as, (no. *Funnier* than) all get out, and deceptively smart. We play from 10/1-10/8. Four of our originally scheduled six shows are already sold out, (!) and so NYMF just extended our run, adding one extra show. Word is we may get another one soon."



The Laramie Project - Special One Night Reading! Ticket proceeds of this reading benefit the Hillcrest Youth Center, a program operated under the auspices of the San Diego LGBT Community Center. Directed by **Darko Tresnjak**. The La Jolla Playhouse will join with theatres across the country in presenting a reading of the Tectonic Theater Project's new work: *The Laramie Project: 10 Years Later.* This compelling and groundbreaking

epilogue to the original piece will premiere on October 12th at Lincoln Center's Alice Tully Hall and at more than 100 other theaters in all fifty states, Canada, Great Britain, Spain, Hong Kong, and Australia. The epilogue focuses on the long-term effects of the murder of Matthew Shepard on the town of Laramie. It explores how the town has changed and how the murder continues to reverberate in the community. The play also includes new interviews with Matthew's mother Judy Shepard and Mathew's murderer Aaron McKinney, who's serving two consecutive life sentences. Several UCSD affiliates are involved in this reading.

Marianne McDonald has a play coming up - *Fires in Heaven*, a free dramatic story about Rabia Al-Adawiyya (717-801), whose sayings and poetry have an honored place in world literature. The work traces her search for both physical and spiritual survival and a night with a thief who came to rob her: he is after her body, and she is after his soul. Previews at The Theatre, Inc., in San Diego, on October 1st, opens October 3rd.

Undergrad Auditions - Auditions for all undergraduate roles for the *The House of Bernarda Alba, Camino Real, Sexual Selection,* and the Undergraduate Production (*Marriage, Medicine, Money, and Mayhem: French Farces by Molière and Feydeau*) will be held on Friday, September 25th, starting at 5:30pm in Galbraith Hall 15. Interested actors should prepare a one to two minute Shakespeare monologue or two monologues (one contemporary and the other Shakespeare). Auditions should last no longer than two minutes. Also be prepared to sing *a capella* if asked and bring an instrument if you can play one. Please note: you must have at the very least the Shakespeare monologue. Callbacks will be: *The House of Bernarda Alba* - morning, Saturday September 26th; *Camino Real* and *Sexual Selection* - Monday September 28th, in the evening. Scripts and the signup sheet for audition times will be at the Department of Theatre and Dance front desk starting today.

Online Alum Database User Alert - Due to security concerns, we recently made some changes to our <u>alumni</u> <u>database</u>. As a result, the password you have been using to access the alumni database will no longer work. The fix for this is really simple, though. To get a new password, go <u>HERE</u>, enter the email address that you've been using to login to the database, then click next. Follow the very simple instructions and you will receive a new password. Your New password *will not be changeable*, so make a note of it. If you do forget it, you can always go back to the login page and click on the "<u>I forgot my password</u>: send it to me" link and get another one. PLEASE NOTE: the email you enter *MUST* be a working email address, because you will be sent your new password via that email address. If it is not a working email address, you will have the option of changing it when you click next. You can <u>search the database here</u>.
