Regents Rally - The UC Board of Regents will rally on the steps of the state Capitol in May alongside students, faculty, staff, alumni, and other UC supporters on May 16th and 17th. The rally at the state Capitol is intended to spotlight the adverse effects that cuts in state funding have had on the university and to build public support for re-investment in higher education. <u>Full article here</u>. The staff advisor program, now in its sixth year, allows for two staff and/or non-Senate academic employees to participate in open sessions of designated committees of the board. 
DEPARTMENT NEWS

Spring Awakening, by Frank Wedekind, directed by Anthony Luciano.


February $3^{rd} - 11^{th}$ in the Mandell Weiss Theatre.

The knowledgeable heartthrob Melchior tries his best to explain sex to his doleful friend Moritz, but he seems more concerned about failing out of school than girls. However, beautiful Wendla learns more about the birds and the bees from Melchior than she may have bargained for as the play tumults towards its shocking end. Just as electrifying and erotic today as it was at its opening in 1906, Wedekind's classic example of German expressionism explores the passion and confusion, the potency and destruction of adolescents coming of age in a time when pubescent urges were just not discussed.

Director **Anthony Luciano** is a third year MFA Directing Candidate at UCSD. At UCSD he has directed *Muzungu* (BNPF '10); *Hedda Gabler* and *Salamander Leviathan* (BNPF '11). He has spent 4 summers as a Faculty Member and Residence Artist with the Vassar College/New York Stage and Film Powerhouse Apprentice

Program. He has assisted directors Ethan McSweeny and Christopher Ashley (amongst others). He has allegedly been seen at: the La Jolla Playhouse; the Berkshire Theatre Festival; Trinity Repertory Company; The Actors Theatre of Louisville; the Brick Theatre; The Shakespeare Theatre in Washington DC; The Denver Center; P73 (amongst others). He is currently part of the creative team looking to workshop and move the new musical *Salamander Leviathan* and is looking forward to begin working on *Doomsurfing*: a new Surf Musical written by the same team. Synopsis: On his way to make it big in New York, aspiring lyricist Fred Stevens meets Edna, a gal with a heart of gold. But the promise of success with a Tin Pan Alley down and out songwriter and his glamorous relative deters Fred from the woman who really loves him. A classic comedy.

George S. Kaufman was the most successful playwright in the American theater during Broadway's golden years between the two World Wars. His particular brand of sharp comedy and satire produced forty-five Broadway plays, the majority of which were successes; all but one of which were written in collaboration with other authors. He was also a talented and precise director of his own work and several other popular plays and musicals. Renowned as a humorist and wit, he was a charter member of the

Algonquin Round Table. Kaufman worked with most of the major theatrical talents of his era and was the winner of two Pulitzer Prizes for drama, including the first Pulitzer ever awarded to a musical.

Naysan is a "company member in absentia" of 3AM Productions, having directed their 2008 production of *Romeo & Juliet*. Other Minnesota-based work includes directing for Hardcover Theater, the collaborative devised pieces *love will give you cholera* and *The Love Party*, Questionable Company Theatre, Bedlam

Theatre, and the Uninvited Company. Since coming to UC San Diego, Naysan has worked as dramaturg for Christopher Ashley's Quinn Martin production of *The Revenger's Tragedy*, and as dramaturg and assistant director on last season's *The Threepenny Opera*. In between these artistic projects, Naysan is pursuing his PhD in the UC San Diego-UC Irvine Joint Doctoral Program in Theatre, researching adaptations of Shakespeare into visual art. He holds a BA in Theater from Carleton College.
