A reading (by the actors) of MFA '01 alum Zina Camblin's play about Whitney Smith's life will took place on the evening of April 10th at Know Theater in Cincinnati. (The theatre will be producing the play next fall.) Whitney Holwadel Smith, born April 10, 1984, and died April 4, 2009, of suicide at the United States Penitentiary in Terre Haute. Smith had been first sent to prison at age 17 for robbery. He wrote he wrote a regular column on prison life and his struggle to rehabilitate for XRay Cincinnati Magazine. Smith was in and out of prison, and was incarcerated at the time of his death. He reportedly had been depressed and emotionally broken after being forced to spend more than a year in the Segregated Housing Unit (The Hole).
