James Conlon conducts an unforgettable production staged by Francesca Zambello, one of the most dynamic directors on the international opera scene. This celebrated production has been enjoyed at Covent Garden London, the Paris Opera as well as Houston, Seattle and Washington Opera. The production opens February 22<sup>nd</sup>. (In English with projected English captions. Produced in association with the Royal Opera House, Covent Garden (London) and the Paris Opera.)

**Undergraduate New Play Festival News -** There are two changes to the ticketing policy for UNPF this year. First, tickets will cost \$5 for students and \$10 for non-students. In the past, UNPF tickets have been

on a donation basis because the Festival was funded by Associated Students, which restricted charging for tickets. This year UNPF is funded by the Theatre & Dance Department and an <u>Indiegogo campaign</u>, and is able to sell tickets through the box office. Second, there's been a change in the complimentary ticket policy. In the past, theatre and dance majors were able to reserve comp tickets for both showcases. This year, however, the box office is only able to offer a complimentary ticket to one of the show -cases. But do not despair! If you cannot afford the \$5 ticket price, you can still see the show for free in exchange for volunteering as an usher. UNPF will send out the official call for ushers soon.
