A Note From The Director

Identities have been a key defining lens through which we talk about our modern world. Personal experience has come to be a defining way we understand oppression. Implicit to that statement is the existence of wider systems under which oppression exists. When we talk about people's personal experiences with oppression we are empathizing with them, however, it is often difficult to convey the larger systems these events are a part of. I have found it crucially important to work on understanding how our identities interact with the systems within our society. The ways in which systems were built have dictated how they continue to oppress groups of people. It has become evident that existing with certain identities in America changes your relation to America, and that the way that systems treat you depends on how you present those identities. Not only is it just how you personally identify, but how a wider group of people view you as a part of that system. peerless draws attention to how our wider system forces us to imagine ourselves as numbers and labels without ever considering what those things mean, and how those labels play into how we view each other as a part of that system.

Beyond that general view of identities and systems, *peerless* draws attention to the failure to understand the importance of identity and why things like diversity and social justice are valuable beyond individual impact. It is that failure to recognize the value of that personal experience that allows for the justification of violence. The dehumanization and reduction of identities are what allow individuals to justify violence against said identities. The play centers importantly on this progression from failing to recognize the wider systems of oppression, failing to empathize with other identities, and finally the enacting of violence because of those earlier worldviews in combination with extreme pressure.

We can often be driven to be short-sighted when we desire things. Ultimately how far we will go to achieve the things we desire is an extreme pressure that permeates our world, and the play itself. *peerless* is a play that addresses the societal pressures placed on us, explores the lengths we go for our dark desires, and shows how a selfish perspective consumes everything around it.
