A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

The feminist thinker, Susan Faludi, argues in her introduction to Jon Robin Baitz' adaptation of Hedda Gabler that Ibsen's controversial work is not a feminist tragedy, but an artist's tragedy. In making the argument she highlights Ibsen's own internal struggle between living up to societal expectations and exploring his wildest instincts. As a woman artist, I feel the story as both. I often imagine what would happen if Madonna or Beyonce or Chappelle Roan found themselves in a small academic town in the middle of nowhere with no way out. She might want to burn someone's hair off! While I'm no fan of Freud, I remain curious about his argument that fundamentally all that mentally ails us stems from the expectation that the individual -- in all her fullness and ferocity -- conform to societal expectations.

I was also struck by a conversation with one of our dramaturgy students who averred that "we like our women celebrities dead." That has been true throughout the Western theatrical canon - all the bad girls--Phaedre, Medea, Lady Macbeth, Miss Julie, and, yes, Hedda--want more than their worlds have rationed for them. So they have to die. Not only that, they are also most often charged with murdering themselves. We fight that narrative.

It's been a thrill to work with our talented and tenacious MFA and BA students as we wrestle with one of Ibsen's most challenging plays. Thank you for joining us!
